
**ORDER**

AND NOW this 28<sup>TH</sup> day of January, 2019, upon consideration of the Notice of Resumption of Operations notifying the Court of the cessation in the 35-day lapse of certain appropriations to the Department of Justice, and notifying that attorneys and employees of the Civil Division of the United States Attorney's Office for the Western District of Pennsylvania who were placed on furlough status during that time will report to work and resume their normal duties on Monday, January 28, 2019,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT the Court's December 26, 2018 Order granting the Omnibus Motion of the United States for a Stay of Miscellaneous Civil Actions in Light of the Lapse in Appropriations, and staying civil matters in which the United States is a party, and in which the interests of the United States are represented by the United States Attorney for this District or the United States Department of Justice as counsel of record, is VACATED,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT the stay of such civil matters is LIFTED effective Monday, January 28, 2019,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT counsel for the United States shall promptly file proposed amended scheduling or other orders to reflect the adjustment of such dates by either the 35-day duration of the lapse in appropriations, or as are otherwise necessary or appropriate.
