In January 2018, the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania made significant changes to the ADR Policies and Procedures to mitigate the number of motions for sanctions filed relative to the ADR process. Under Rule 2.8 of the revised policies and procedures, all parties are specifically required to participate in mediation in good faith. But what does "good faith" really mean? And if the opposing party is not acting in good faith, what should you do?
