<p>This time table reflects deadlines indicated in Judge Horan’s “Standing Order and Procedures on Civil Motion Practice.” The Court may issue a specific briefing order that supersedes the time frames herein. Specific briefing orders will be entered in individual cases for motions related to trial. <i>Pursuant to the Standing Order, “The Court may decide motions that do not implicate the substantial rights of the opposing party . . . without a response.” In addition, “Motions to extend deadlines . . . are more likely to be decided without response because of the Court’s inherent discretion over this subject. If non-moving counsel wish to file a response, they should advise the Court by telephone immediatley.”</i></p>			
<b>Scheduling Motions and Motions regarding Case Management Deadlines</b>	7 days	Only if requested/ 5 or 7 days	---
<b>Discovery Motions</b>	7 days	Only if requested/ 5 or 7 days	Only with leave of court
<b>Motion to Dismiss</b>	21 days	7 days	Only with leave of court
<b>Motion for Summary Judgment</b>	28 days	14 days	Only with leave of court
<b>All other Motions</b>	7 days	Only if requested/ 5 or 7 days	---
